

Behaviour Management Policy

We aim ;

- *To promote acceptable behavior and respect for others.
- *To promote an environment where children feel safe from being hurt, or hindered by anyone else.
- *To create a situation in which children can develop self-discipline and self-esteem, in an atmosphere of mutual respect and encouragement.

In order to achieve this;

All students and volunteers will be made aware of our Behaviour policy and given a clear explanation of the rules governing the children's behaviour and the agreed ways the adults manage their behaviour.

We have established clear expectations and boundaries for all concerned;

- *All adults will ensure that the rules are applied consistently so that the children are secure in knowing what to expect and can build up useful habits of behaviour.
- * Adults will use methods such as discussion, distraction and re-directing the child's attention to manage behaviour.
- * We will take positive steps to avoid a situation where children receive attention ONLY in return for undesirable behaviour.
- * Behaviour management will be regularly discussed at staff meetings and strategies agreed, so that staff can support each other.
- * We will seek and attend training on behaviour management, both in house and through early years and day care partnership.
- * We will ensure that children who misbehave continuously will be given one to one support.

Encouraging positive behaviour;

Ways to encourage positive behaviour include;

- * Adults will encourage and acknowledge desirable behaviour such as kindness and willingness to share.
- * Adults will be a good role model at all times for the children with regard to courtesy and care for others.
- * Consulting with children about rules.
